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LETTER FROM THE MOTHER OF ADEEB DALWAI

Adeeb Dalwai was one year and five months when he was found face down in the swimming pool of our house. We rushed him to Red Cross Hospital and on our way to hospital we found no heart beat or pulse. When we arrived at the hospital they were trying to resuscitate him and only after 15 min they got his heart to beat again. He never woke up and stayed in a deep sleep for a week. The doctors gave him 48 hours to live, they said he was not going to make it but with the Allah's (SWT) mercy, he pulled through. When he woke up he had no eye sight and could not move and had heavy spasms. He stayed in hospital for three months so that the doctors could figure out how badly his brain was damaged due to lack of oxygen to the brain. They later discovered him to have 90% brain damaged. He would not be able to do anything for himself they said.

I then had to learn everything there is to care for a disabled child and it was hard for me as I had other kids to care for as well. I had to learn how to bed bath him, give his medication, turn him from one side to another, how to feed him via his gastrostomy tube. They also discovered that he could not swallow and therefore had to suction the saliva out of his mouth, I was not familiar with that and it was something I struggled to do. After three months he came home but ended up most of the time in hospital due to chest infections. Adeeb was put on permanent chronic medication to help with his condition. Epilim crushable and Lethal also to help with fits, Baclofen to help with spasming, Arem to help him sleep, , laxette to help with regular bowl movement and pain medication to help with any pain he might be going through.

This situation affected me as I needed to care for him and had no clue what to do everything was new to me. It is a big responsibility to care for a disabled child since the age of 1 year and six months. You have to put in a lot of time and dedication as you have to get up early in the morning and sleep late at night the same routine everyday. It's quite difficult as I cannot have a social life and can't go out with my other kids. But it's a sacrifice I'm willing to make. I have to be emotionally strong for my kids even though sometimes I feel like breaking down but can't. I take a lot of pride in caring for my son as for the past 14 years and can proudly say that he doesn't have one bed sore on his body. My eldest daughter has to care for him when I need to go out to do things and it is a big responsibility that she needs to take on as well.

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REFERAL FOR ONGOING MEDICAL CARE

This is to say that i was paediatrician caring for Adeeb following his near drowning on 12/10/2003.

ADEEB'S PROBLEMS

1. Severe hypoxic brain damage with subsequent severe mental and motor handicap.
 2. Seizures controlled on Epilim and Phenobarbitone.
 3. Generalized spasticity and visual impairment.
 4. Severe Muscular spasms and hyperpyrexia treated with Baclofen and Arem.
 5. Pseudobulbar Palsy and unable to swallow requiring regular suctioning.
 6. Underwent a Nissen anti reflux procedure and insertion of feeding gastrostomy on the 21/11/2003.
- On complete enteral liquid feeds via MiKey.

MEDICATION

1. Epilim crushable 200mg 2x Daily
2. Phenobarbitone (Lethyl) 120mg Daily
3. Arem 10mg Nocte
4. Baclofen 30mg 3 x Daily
5. Laxon 10ml 2x Daily
6. Seretide 25/125NDI 2 puffs 2x daily as required
7. Pynmed tab 3x daily as required

TO DATE

1. I have not seen Adeeb for some time, but have suffered from less frequent respiratory tract infections which are managed with antibiotics, nebulisations and physiotherapy.
2. He is bed bound and requires full time care.
3. He is fed via a gastrostomy tube with nutritional advice from a dietician.
4. Seizures have not been an issue any further.
